We will be learning about mammals', birds', fishes', amphibians', reptiles' and humans' needs for survival. We will also investigate ways in which humans can stay healthy. We will be exploring different materials and carry out simple tests. We will also identify ways we can reduce plastic waste in school.	coding We will understand that an algorithm is a set of instructions which lead to an outcome and we wil learn to sequence instructions. We will learn that the list of instructions we give a computer is called a program.			
History – Bonfire Night/ Remembrance Day. We will learn about the events leading up to the gunpowder plot and Guy Fawkes's role in the gunpowder plot. We will use sources to find out key features of the event and recognise ways in which we celebrate Bonfire Night. We will also use sources to find out about Remembrance Day including what happens on the day and the significance of poppies.	Geography - The Continents and Oceans of the World. We will name and locate the world's seven continents and name a country in each continent (except Antarctica) using maps, atlases and globes to locate the continents. We will use simple compass directions and directional language to describe the position of the continents. We will name and locate the world's five oceans and use aerial photographs and maps to recognise landmarks			
Art – (Access art) We will become familiar with the idea that artists are inspired by exploring and collecting things in and around the environment. We will create our own land art.
